THE WORKERS OF CHILE NEED YOUR HELP

On September 11, the left-wing Popular Unity government of Chile was overthrown by a brutal military dictatorship. In the weeks that have followed, the Chilean working class has been fighting for its life.

Tens of thousands of workers have been killed by the Chilean Army - still more have been imprisoned in huge prison camps and may be executed. Thousands of prisoners have been beaten to death or tortured. One-third of the entire working class have been sacked from their jobs.— a matter of starvation when prices have gone up by 600% in two weeks and are expected to reach 1800% by the end of the year.

For the workers who still have jobs, the working week has been increased to 48 hours. Dockers at Valparaiso who refused to accept new manning arrangements were shot down. The Chilean TUC has been outlawed, and nationalised industries handed back to private ownership. The Army has seized control of all the big universities and is making huge bonfires of books.

Under Allende's Popular Unity government, the workers and peasants of Chile were working to build a socialist society. They wanted to run the economy in the interests of the mass of the Chilean people - not to line the pockets of American businessmen and the parasitic Chilean upper classes. Major industries were nationalised - metals, coal, automobiles, textiles, banks - wages improved by 60% and social services developed.

The upper classes tried to wreck the economy by deliberately sabotaging production and by profiteering on the Black Market. To prevent this, the workers occupied their factories and organised committees to keep production running. Local committees were set up to make sure goods were distributed fairly at a reasonable price.

The murderous military takeover in September had been planned for over a year by the Chilean Army and upper classes with U.S. backing. The workers and peasants fought back with all the means at their disposal - hundreds were shot down defending their occupied factories - but lacked the preparation needed to fight the military technology of the USA.

Since the coup the upper and middle classes have been encouraged to report anyone "behaving suspiciously". Thousands of phonecalls come in every day and the number of death sentences is still rising.

But there is a strong tradition of organisation and solidarity in the Chilean working class. Reports are coming in of armed resistance in many areas - of hospital workers refusing to treat wounded soliders - of poisoned food being offered to the Army. In other areas open resistance is impossible but the workers are secretly rebuilding their organisations for the future.

The Tories have shown whom they support. The British Embassy in Chile turned back refugees fleeing for their lives. Britain has recognised the military Junta and trade goes on as usual, including the huge British imports of Chilean copper for the electrical and engineering industries. At Wallsend two Chilean warships are being refitted, and Hawker Siddeley is supplying the dictatorship with fighter planes, while another British firm is training officers for the Chilean Air Force.


