Statement of Mrs. Elena García Lucero – Objective: impact on the present case that the alleged denials of justice and lack of adequate reparation have had in her life and that of her family.

On arrival in England our lives changed completely because we lost our world: our parents, brothers, and the rest of our family and friends remained in Chile, the place where we lived, where we worked, and our dreams. While we were in Chile and until Leopoldo's detention and torture, we were a normal, happy family: Leopoldo and I were working, we had a good income and our three daughters were studying in educational centres of good quality. We lived

on flat land from where you could see the cordillera of the mountains... We spent time with friends and family. I went to church every Sunday. I had a lot of faith. Christmas and the new year were beautiful celebrations, filled with human qualities and love. Our families gave us great emotional support. They were always with us, supporting us in everything, and helping us resolve our problems.

On arriving in England our lives disappeared. At the time I kept hoping that things would change and that we would one day return to Chile. I hoped that Pinochet would fall from power and that Chile would remember us. But time just went by.

In Chile nobody has been put in

jail for what happened to us; nobody knows the truth about what happened, nobody knows where our savings were, nobody thought about the damage that I have suffered as a woman or thought about the damage my family had to suffer. Our dreams and life projects disappeared. From one day to the next we had to fight to survive in a world that is not ours. On arriving in the United Kingdom we were victims of discrimination in social housing where they gave us lodging. They put bags of rubbish outside our door and they threw things at our window. They didn't want us in Great Britain either.

I had a stable job in Chile. I worked as a secretary in the Ministry of Housing. Leopoldo

worked in the Betting Department of the Racetrack. When we arrived in the United Kingdom we had to confront living in a culture totally different from our own: another religion, different customs, another morality and a new language, which none of us spoke. Nor did we know anybody. Although I tried, I could not secure a job equivalent to the one I had in Chile. Nobody wanted us, but I didn't even speak English. Leopoldo also needed me by his side. The necessity to provide things for the home forced me to seek employment where I could so that I could respond to my family's needs. Those days were very hard.

When I fell in love with Leopoldo, he was a good, loving person, happy and very kind. He became

In London, and in spite of the humanitarian aid given by the United Kingdom, it fell to me to take charge of the home, of Leopoldo and of my daughters because money was tight and it did not stretch to everything that we needed. My dreams got put in second place. I could not cry, and I could not get depressed because I was the emotional support for everybody in the home. I always felt very alone: my mother, my brother, and my friends who were such big parts of my world and who listened to me were not around. Those were hard years, of great privations, of having to endure, and of silence.

Leopoldo and I dreamed of having a house in Santiago. Leopoldo and

I were saving money to buy one. This would have been possible because I worked in the Ministry of Housing and I would have had the Ministry's help. We wanted to leave the house as an inheritance to our daughters. In England we have never been able to buy a house. We live in social housing [council housing] which is the housing provided by the British Government to people of limited economic means. The house we live in does not belong to us.

When democracy returned to Chile, the Government should have used the consulate to ask us if we wanted to return. The Chilean Government should have put those who tortured Leopoldo in jail and it should have offered us the work that we once had and a place to

live. But Chile did none of these things. I know that Chile has finally^s opened a criminal investigation into Leopoldo's torture but nothing has happened. Those responsible for what happened to Leopoldo and his family remain free. I do not understand why justice has been so delayed. It is as if justice is only for rich people and not for poor people or exiles like us. If there were justice, it would recognize how our dignity has been violated. It would put the guilty in jail and it would offer us the conditions necessary so that we could live as we had been living before. However, my country's lack of a response has only aggravated the situation. We have been waiting almost forty years for justice, for Chile to remember us and treat us with



dignity. Until today, I continue to suffer in silence. I have lost hope. My soul is in pain knowing that I am nothing to my country, that I had to abandon my dreams. But it also pains me to see the way Chile has affected my family.

Leopoldo stopped being politically active and in good spirits, and became bad tempered, disabled by the torture he suffered. He lives depressed. He feels persecuted. He watches the news all the time. He needs my help and support constantly. I am the one who cooks for him, cares for him, and helps him. As a result of his torture, Leopoldo has never been able to learn English. Similarly, as a result of his condition, he has never been able to work like he did in Chile.

Our relationship as a couple



changed dramatically. In Chile we went out a lot with our friends. We went to concerts because I liked music very much. We ate Chilean food. Leopoldo courted me a great deal. But all that lies in the past. Here we have had to forget those special moments. The Leopoldo whom I fell in love with ceased to exist and the conditions we needed to continue living life as a couple were not the same as those we had when we lived in Chile.

The absence of justice also affected my three daughters since they live in the United Kingdom, in another culture and another language which have had a great impact on their lives and educational opportunities. In Chile they could have been professionals, with a prosperous future in which they

could build their homes. In England, the problem was the language. It was very difficult for them to develop academically, and even more difficult because of the racism that always existed in our daily lives. These things impeded their access to better lives with opportunities.

When we arrived in London my daughters already had an idea about what they wanted to study, especially the oldest one, Maria Elena. She wanted to be an architect and she would have finished her degree in Chile; she was already applying for university entrance in Chile. While she was in Chile, she remained in Santiago taking care of my mother, who was already quite old. She speaks quite a lot about the emotional damage

My middle daughter, Gloria, arrived during her secondary school years. She was 11 or 12 years old and she suffered discrimination in her school. Today she is a secretary in a medical centre. The youngest, Francisca, was in kindergarten and maybe was the most affected of my three girls. Leaving Chile affected her a great deal: to leave her world behind, to see us suffer, to confront a different world and a new language. When we placed her in school in London, they rang us and told us that she had problems speaking and they sent her to a language therapist. She had to go to a special school that limited her future possibilities. I have always



thought that her language problem was a consequence of the emotional impact that she experienced as a little girl, that affected all of us, and that continues to affect us.

For my daughters it was very difficult to see me and Leopoldo suffer. To see how our household roles changed. To see how we fought day after day to keep moving forward. They feel a great frustration knowing that they cannot do much to help us because they too have to survive in the United Kingdom. I also think that the change of household roles impacted my daughters. They could not grow up with the mother and father that they wanted and that their friends had at school.

When we left Chile, my mother was an old woman and she had sicknesses associated with her old age. But on our departure her health deteriorated a great deal. I could not take care of my mother's health, something that one would expect from a daughter. Leopoldo has always lived in fear of Chile and the mere idea that I should go to my mother's funeral while Pinochet was in power made him very anxious. My mother died. I was here. I could not go to her funeral. I have not been able to recover from that loss. I could not bury my mother.

Something that gives me a great deal of pain is to see how my country has forgotten about me. In our house, it was not just Leopoldo who was detained, tortured, and

expelled from the country. What they did to him and what continues to have a terrible affect in my life and in the lives of my daughters is that Chile has not recognized us as victims. Nor have they provided reparations for the damage that we have had to deal during our lives. The pension that Leopoldo receives is very small and it does not cover me. PRAIS, the Chilean health system, can only be used in Chile, and not in the United Kingdom, where Leopoldo, my daughters, and I live.

Today when I look back, I think that we are in the same situation that we were in during the dictatorship in Chile. We go on living without justice. We do not have the same social status that we had in Chile and we cannot realise

Our daughters have children and their lives are in the United Kingdom. Because of this I would not return to Chile at this moment of my life, and I believe that I am not obliged to return. Chile never did anything for me. It never offered me the conditions necessary to return and now it is too late. I am 82 years old. Everything that I have in life is my family: Leopoldo, my three daughters, and my grandchildren. All of them are here in the United Kingdom. They cannot ask that I

contacto.

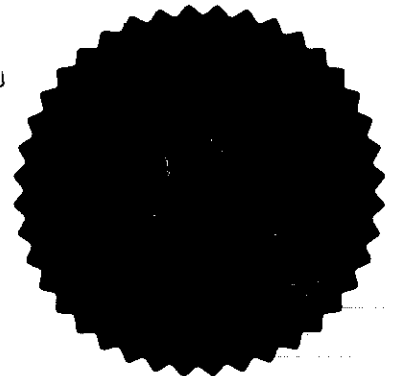
